

SOD-523 Plastic-Encapsulate ESD Protection Diodes

DESCRIPTION

The ESD5B5CL is designed to protect voltage sensitive component from ESD and transient voltage events. Excellent clamping capability, low leakage, and fast response time, make these parts ideal for ESD protection on designs where board space is at a premium. Because of its small size, it is suited for use in cellular phones, portable devices, digital cameras, power supplies and many other portable applications where board space comes at a premium. Also because of its low capacitance, it is suited for use in high frequency designs such as USB 2.0 high speed,VGA,DVI,SDI and other high speed line applications.

This device has been specifically designed to protect sensitive components which are connected to data and transmission lines from overvoltage caused by ESD (electrostatic discharge), and EFT (electrical fast transients).

Fig 1 8/20 μ s Waveform per IEC61000-4-5

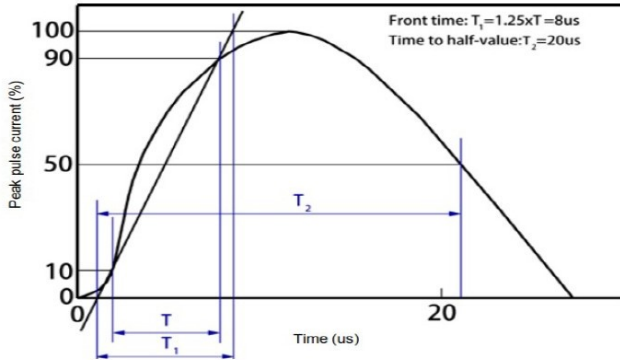


Fig 2 Contact Discharge Current Waveform per IEC 61000-4-2)

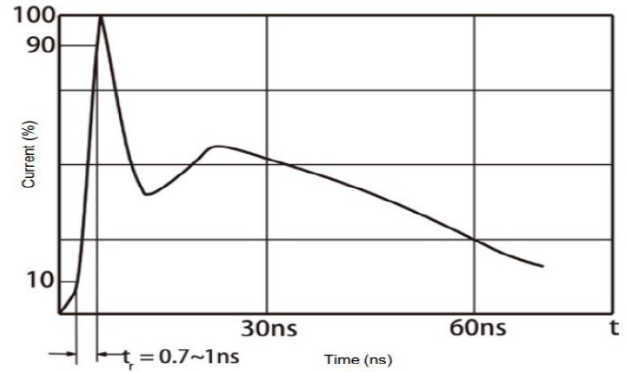


Fig 3 Power Derating Curve

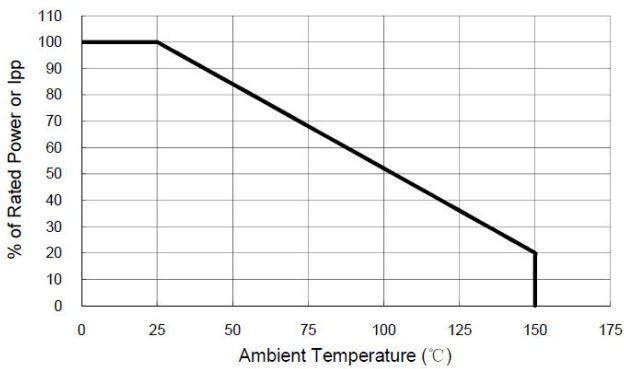


Fig 4 Voltage Sweeping

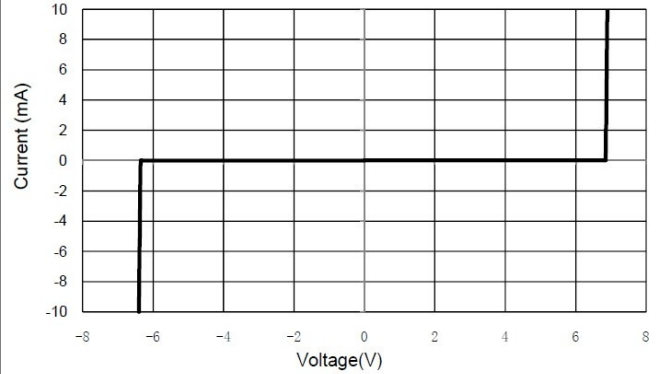


Fig 5 Voltage vs Capacitance

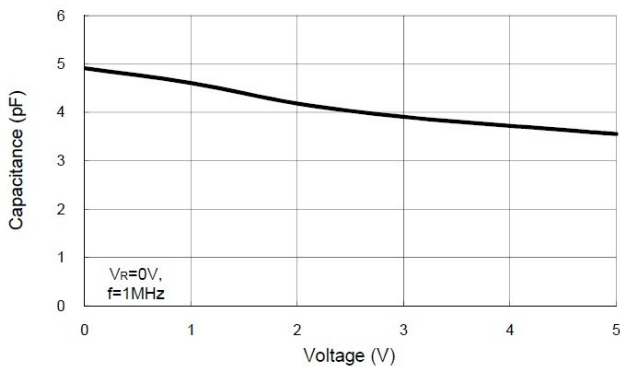
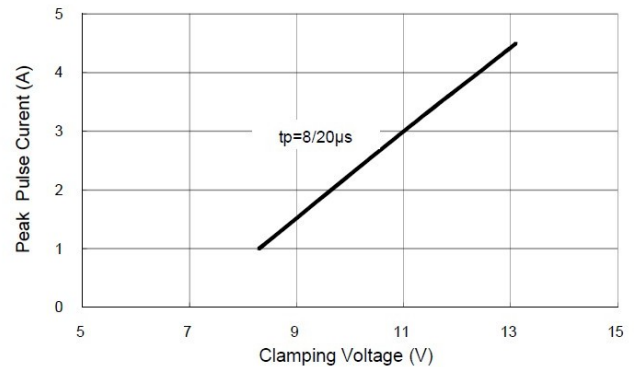


Fig 6 Clamping Voltage vs Peak Pulse Current
